Volunteer Needed - No Prior Experience Required!!

The Tramping Club has a Personal Locator Beacon that is borrowed by club members for both club and personal backpacking trips. Should an accident occur they would activate the beacon to alert rescue services. However before the Rescue Co-ordination Centre sends out the helicopter they need to confirm that the beacon has been set off by trampers out on the track and so they ring the contact numbers registered for the beacon. When they reach a contact, the contact needs to confirm "Yes we have trampers in Nelson" (for example) and so the rescue begins.

We need a third volunteer person for our list of contacts. When people borrow the beacon you will be emailed with what they are doing and when – so in the unlikely event of a phone call you will be able to say 'yes' or 'no'. Being on the list does not mean you have to have to restrict your life in any way so that you are contactable (because we have 3 people on the list - so someone should be around) but we would prefer a volunteer who is around much of the year and someone who normally has their mobile on.

Letter from '2 for the Road'

It seems unbelievable, but we have now been on the road for 6 weeks. Most of it in the Nelson-Golden Bay area, currently the driest part of the country-Nelson has had only 17mls of rain in the past month with Wesport-225 and Hokitika 350mls. Highlights of the past month have included:

- 1- Nelson's Great Taste cycle trail including sections; Nelson to Richmond via the old rail route and return via Tahuna Richmond to Rabbit Island, Richmond to Wakefield, Tasman to Motueka, Tasman to Mapua and Motueka to Kaiteriteri.
- 2- Tramps in Abel Tasman National Park based at Totaranui (3 nights), Takaka (2 nights) and Marahau (2 nights). It certainly is very popular with the overseas visitors.
- 3- Golden Bay; Puponga and Collingwood.

Next stop is St Arnaud where the snow level is currently down to 800 metres, should be marvellous, then it's on to Christchurch over the Lewis Pass, where we will catch up with ex members Carol & Ray Twist before returning to Auckland for a couple of weeks.
