The Presidents Report

Namaste. I'm writing this a little ahead of time, as I am in Nepal until the night before our December club night.

I do hope you can make it to our December club night on the 11th (remember a week earlier than normal) for a bit of Christmas fun &don't forget our end of year BBQ at the Kaipara Sculpture Gardens on the 17th. See details in the club program.

The recently completed Waterview shared path now open giving us another 3km of walking and cycling options – perfect for our Wednesday night walk programme. From my house I can now cycle to the city & all the way to St Helliers in one direction, out to Henderson and the Twin Streams path to the

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west and Mangere/Stonefields in the south! Plans are now underway for a path between Avondale and New Lynn. I have noticed an increase in cyclist using the path beside the North Western motorway as they zip passed me as I crawl along the motorway. Got to be a message there!

As if kauri die back was not enough to be faced with, now we are being asked to look out for Myrtle rust. Myrtle Rust is a serious fungal disease that affects plants in the myrtle family including Puhutakawa, Manuka and Rata. This fungus has the potential to desecrate many of our native plant species. MR attaches to young soft and actively growing leaves, shoot tips and young stems. Initial symptoms are powdery bright yellow or orange/yellow pustules on leaves. Keep an eye out. If you think you have seen MR do not touch or disturb the plant. Take photo and contact Min Primary Industries on 0800 809966. www.mpi.govt.nz for more info.

Batty about bats? Did you know you can borrow a bat detector for free from AKL council and go batty with a bit of bat spotting. The bat detector picks up the ecolocation (sound navigation) calls that bats make (that humans can't hear) and converts them into audible clicks and buzzes. The stream restoration and pest control work carried out by Project Twin Streams has attracted insects that bats eat and brought bats back into urban areas. How cool is that? Activity best done at dawn & dusk in summer. Email biodiversity@aucklandcouncil.govt.nz to borrow a bat detector.

The club has had a great year with a large range of activities. Your hard working committee has put in a lot of effort to bring together a variety of tramps, club nights and social events. A couple of highlights would have to be our club's "bush walking" expedition to the Gold Coast and our 40th birthday celebrations in March.

With no January club night, our trip program might not be 100% complete at the time of this Newsletter going to print, so do keep an eye out on our website for any additions and changes that might not appear in this newsletter. During our Christmas break, do feel free to gather up fellow club members for an impromptu tramp.
