Last Sunday a big group of us enjoyed a sunny day visiting a stunning farm in Kumeu with panoramic views back to Auckland city and Rangitoto as well as towards the sea at Muriwai. During the day we saw several groves of well-established kauri and that night I attended the Auckland Track Users Forum established in response to the track closures to prevent the spread of kauri dieback in the Auckland region. I had heard the meetings could be lively with conflicting viewpoints but I was pleased that consensus was quickly achieved that we work with the council to help prioritise the order in which tracks are upgraded and that we have to accept their overall plan to protect kauri. I was particularly impressed by the leadership of the younger people who want more tramping tracks available but also want healthy kauri and are prepared to be patient.

Another positive is that a significant amount of work is being done in the Hunuas opening up some great tramping opportunities in the not so distant future.

I will be collecting information soon from you about our priorities with regard to tracks that are still closed.


